English/Come and See

This week in English we have learned about Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. We dramatised the story of Palm Sunday using props that the Physical Development group made during their lesson. We listened to the sad story of Good Friday and were all very sensible. We made an Easter garden out of soil, stones and sticks and said a prayer. One of the children said 'Jesus died so that we could live'. We were all pleased that the Easter story had a happy ending when Jesus rose again on Easter Sunday. We said a prayer to thank God for letting Jesus live forever.

Maths

This week in Maths we have practiced answering missing number problems (e.g. $2 + _ = 10$, $6 + _ = 20$). We proved Captain Hook wrong when he said that "you can't solve an addition missing number problem by using subtraction". We learned that the opposite of addition is subtraction so the quickest way to work out the answer to $6 + _ = 20$ is to work out $20 - 6 =$ using a number line. Well Done Year One you are all fabulous mathematicians!

Letters and Sounds

This week in Letters and Sounds we have started learning what letters we would need to write a word down by thinking about alternative sounds. We practiced alternative spellings for the 'ai' grapheme and the 'c' grapheme.

We learned that the following graphemes make the same sound as the 'c' grapheme: 'k' like in the word 'kit', 'ck' like in the word 'lick' and 'ch' like in the word 'school'.

We also noticed that sometimes words with the 'x' phoneme in can be a bit tricky. Sometimes the 'x' phoneme sounds like it should be written like this 'cks'. For

example, the word 'box' could accidentally be written 'bocks'. As a class we wrote the sentences 'The quick fox kicks like a cat' and 'A box of cookies is quite cool'.

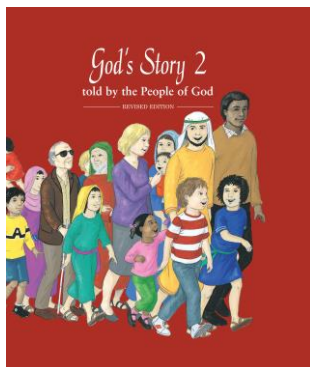
Miss George

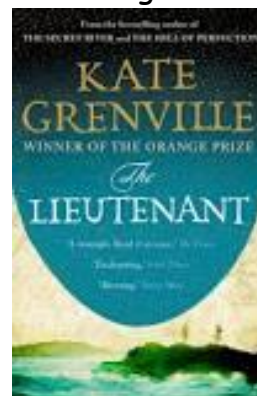
