

KS2 Visit to Church



Year 5 and 6 Police Officer Visit

Recently, Y5 and Y6 have both been fortunate enough to have visitors come to class to talk to them which have reinforced our core values of respect, responsibility and resilience.

Both classes had a visit from our designated police community support officer, Hazel Deardon, who spoke to the children about anti-social behaviours and the consequences of these actions. She also went into details about the judicial system and each class were given scripts to act out a trial that included every role in the court (Jurors from both classes quickly found Goldilocks to be guilty of breaking and entering, theft and destruction of property!) In doing this, the children learnt so much about the process in a courtroom and the importance of demonstrating our values at all times, whether we are among friends or in the wider community.

Bully Busters

This week, Y5 and Y6 were visited by Natalie from Bully Busters, who encouraged them to make positive choices and to understand the impact of their actions on others. The children all discussed the importance of taking ownership of their personal actions and they recognised the role they play in making our school a better place. As members of their class, it is up to them to make a difference; they are responsible for everything that happens, so by making positive choices, they can improve any situation!

Bully Busters' main statement of 'Together, we can NAIL it!' (Nice, Accepting, Inclusive, Listen) is an acronym that was created here in Holy Family by our children who really absorbed their message! Bully Busters' loved it so much, they adopted it and use it in every school they visit. We know that together, we can NAIL it when we demonstrate our values.
