Owl and the Pussy Cat Trail

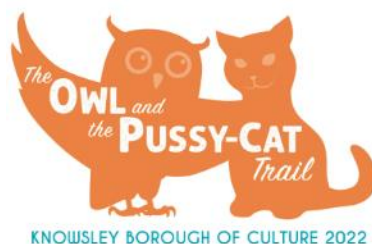
