

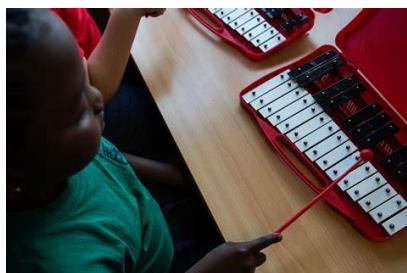
Year 2: Unit 4 **Zootime**

Themes: Reggae and animals

1 - Listening: Zootime Find the pulse as you are listening to the music: Dance, wiggle, march, clap. Instruments/voices you can hear: Keyboard, drums, bass, electric guitar, singers.

2 - Musical Activities Find the pulse!

- Be an animal of your choice Clapping Rhythms
- Copy and clap back rhythms
- Clap the rhythm of your name
- Clap the rhythm of your favourite animal
- Make up your own rhythms Pitch is high and low sounds. We add pitch to the pulse and rhythm when we sing and play an instrument.



Singing and dancing and having fun! Playing instruments using up to two notes – C or C + D. Which part did you play? Improvise using the notes C + D:

- Challenge 1 Clap and Improvise
- Challenge 2 Sing, Play and Improvise
- Challenge 3 Improvise

Which challenge did you get to? Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms, choosing from the notes C + D or C, D + E.

3 - Perform & Share A class performance of Zootime. Introduce your performance to your audience. Can you include some funky moves? Have a fantastic time; enjoy it! Talk about it together afterwards. How did it make you feel? Will you record it?



Key Vocabulary:

Audience – people who are listeners

Bass - a tone of low pitch

Drums - a drum is a type of musical instrument . In most cases it consists of a shell with a stretched skin or covering. When the covering is hit with a hand or a stick, it vibrates and makes a sound

Dynamics – refers to the volume or loudness of the sound or note

Electric Guitar - stringed instrument that makes music using "electric pickups" that change the vibration of the strings into electric current. sent to an amplifier that changes it to sound

Improvise - playing an instrument or singing in which the musician makes up the music as they play.

Keyboard - a portable electronic musical instrument with a row of keys like that of a piano

Melody - a series of different pitches that form a tune

Perform - music and ideas shared with a listener or audience

Pitch - describes how low or high a note sound

Pulse - a steady beat

Reggae – is a unique form of rock music which originated in Jamaica.

Rhythm - Pattern in time

Tempo - describe the speed at which you play
