

Year 5: Unit 3
Make You Feel My Love

Themes: Pop ballads

1 – Listen & Appraise: Make You Feel My Love (Pop)

Structure: Piano intro, verse 1, verse 2, chorus, verse 3, interlude, chorus, verse 4 with tag ending.

Instruments/voices you can hear: Strings, piano, guitar, bass, drums.

Can you find the pulse as you are listening? Is the tempo fast, slow or in-between? Dynamics? Texture?

2 – Musical Activities using glocks and/or recorders

Warm-up games play and copy back using up to 3 notes –

C, D + E.

Bronze: C

Silver: C + D

Gold: C, D + E challenge.

Which challenge did you get to?

Singing in unison.

Play instrumental parts with the song by ear and/or from notation using the easy or medium part. You will be using up to 3 notes – C, D + E. Which part did you play?

Improvise using up to 3 notes – C, D + E.


Bronze: C

Silver: C + D

Gold: C, D + E challenge

Which challenge did you get to? Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms choosing from the notes

C, D + E or C, D, E, F + G.



3 – Perform & Share Decide how your class will introduce the performance. Perhaps add some choreography? Tell your audience how you learnt this song and why. Record the performance and talk about it afterwards.

The performance will include one or more of the following:

Improvisations • Instrumental performances • Compositions

Key Vocabulary:

Ballad - form of storytelling

Bass - a tone of low pitch

Chorus - a section of a song that is repeated at least twice and embodies the overall lyrical message of the song

Compose - creating or writing a piece of music

Cover - new performance or recording by a musician other than the original performer or composer

Drums - a drum is a type of musical instrument . In most cases it consists of a shell with a stretched skin or covering. When the covering is hit with a hand or a stick, it vibrates and makes a sound

Dynamics – refers to the volume or loudness of the sound or note

Guitar - stringed instrument that makes music from the vibrations of strings

Improvise - playing an instrument or singing in which the musician makes up the music as they play. .

Interlude - when the music is interrupted or spaced out

Melody - a series of different pitches that form a tune

Piano - a musical stringed instrument played by depressing keys that cause hammers to strike the strings

Pitch - describes how low or high a note sound

Pulse - a steady beat

Rhythm - Pattern in time

Strings - flexible material that a musical instrument holds under tension so that they can vibrate freely, but controllably

Structure - the arrangement and order of the parts or sections of the music

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tag ending - a short tag of four to eight bars at the end of a verse or the ending chords of a song, usually consistent with the last line of lyrics

Tempo - describe the speed at which you play

Texture - different layers of a piece of music are combined to produce the overall sound

Timbre - what makes two different musical instruments sound different from each other, even when each instrument plays the same musical note

Verse - a series of lyrics used to express the main point and topic of a song
