**Monument**—a statue or other sculpture meant to honor a great person.

**Place of worship**—a building for religious services

**Region**—an area, especially part of a country or the world having definable characteristics but not always fixed boundaries.

**Capital city**—a city or town where the central government of a country is.

**Facilities**—places where certain things happen

**Local**—the area where you live,.

**Metro**—an underground railway system in a city

#### nucleated

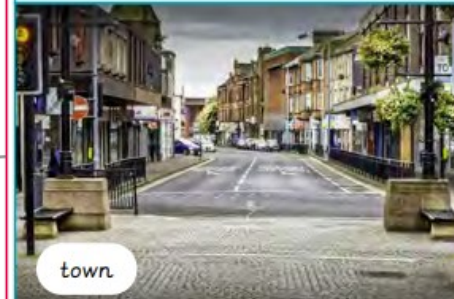
Formed around a central area.
