Residential land—land used for houses and apartment blocks

<u>Transportation—</u>a way of getting something from one place to another.

<u>Linear</u>—arranged in a straight line.

Nucleated—formed around a central area.

Dispersed—spread out over a wide area.

Land use—how communities use land.

<u>Country border—</u> a line, where one region is next to the other.

Dispersed—spread over a wide area.

<u>Memorial</u>—an object or place which serves as a focus for the memory or the commemoration of something

Monument—a statue or other sculpture meant to honor a great person.

<u>Place of worship—</u>*a building for religious services*

Region—an area, especially part of a country or the world having definable characteristics but not always fixed boundaries.


Capital city—a city or town where the central government of a country is.
