

Beacon Counselling Trust providing free training on gambling harm.



Beacon Counselling Trust provide gambling-harm support services across the Northwest. As part of their support, they deliver free training to staff working in numerous organisations across the region. In 2023 the Council, Healthwatch and Citizens Advice joined Beacon's Workplace Charter to Reduce Gambling-Related Harms. As part of our continued promotion for recognising and supporting gambling-harm the Council have organised three, online 90-minute training sessions. Staff from any organisation across Knowsley are welcome to join these sessions.

Evidence suggests that Knowsley residents gamble more often and in higher numbers than in other places in the country. As many of our residents live on low incomes this can have devastating impacts causing harm to a person's family and social networks, employment, finances and mental health.

The Bet You Can Help Now workshop helps to understand the nature of gambling related harms and the impact on health and wellbeing, it also supports learners to competently implement a brief early intervention with anyone at risk of, or experiencing, gambling harms, and how to signpost to specialist support services.
